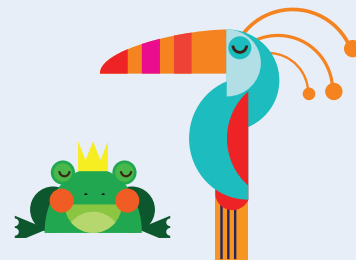


Soothing with Our Senses

- Wrap your favorite blanket around you

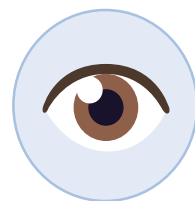
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Taste
